The CPSM Exam—What an Experience!

Since moving to Albuquerque with my military husband and three children, I have administered the 401k and Pension Plans for a law firm and been a Vice President for an actuarial consulting firm specializing in pension plans. Before that, I worked in the aerospace industry, for a university engineering department, and for a software firm.

I joined the procurement organization at Sandia Laboratories in 2003. Obtaining my MBA in 2007 opened the door to a staff level buying position that has proved challenging and very rewarding. My initial buying experience was placing and administering a variety of contract types. Since January 2010, I have been working with international procurements.

I decided to take the CPSM exams last year as I felt studying for them would broaden my global supply chain knowledge and position me for a move to international procurement. Also, my procurement colleagues encouraged me to take the next step in becoming a true supply chain professional.

To be perfectly honest, all three exams were challenging as well as frustrating. The study materials only partially prepare an individual for a successful experience. Without the CPSM preparation class sponsored by NAPM, I know I wouldn't have obtained my certification. Now that the exams are over, I'm very glad that I obtained my CPSM. I would recommend the certification program for anyone that wants to broaden and sharpen their supply chain knowledge. It wasn't easy, but it definitely was an experience that I don't regret!

Wine Pairings for the Summer Months

Here are a few suggestions for pairing white wine with summer appetizers and nibblers. Tried and true – you can't go wrong!

Pair a dry Riesling with a homemade batch of guacamole and blue corn chips. My favorite wine in this combination is the Chateau St. Michelle Dry Riesling available everywhere and it's a steal at \$10-12. This is an amazing pairing.

Pair homemade potato chips or sweet potato chips with a sparkling wine or sparkling rose. Try going local with Gruet's Blanc de Noir which is a bargain at \$14 or splurge and go with the Grand Rose at \$32. The salty chips and the bubbles are spectacular together.

Pair takeout sushi with Bonnie Doon's Pacific Rim Dry Riesling. This Riesling is another bargain sipper at \$13-15.

Brancott's Reserve Sauvignon Blanc from New Zealand at \$16 captures all the fruity citrus appeal and is excellent served with any dish containing fresh lemon. Try mixing fresh goat cheese with lemon peel and roll in some fresh herbs like Rosemary or Thyme; serve with crackers and the Brancott SB.

For a perfect ending, this wine is unbelievable when paired with fresh lemon ice cream. Start with your favorite vanilla ice cream and then add some fresh squeezed lemon juice (1T) and the zest of one lemon to your ice cream maker while churning. A match made in heaven!
